is vitally linked to our own.

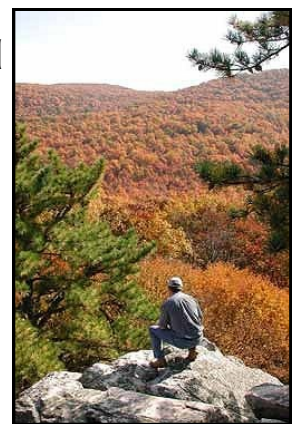
## January 31– Paul Zeph Protecting the Kittatinny Ridge Corridor
