

Save the Boardwalks!

Why do the boardwalks need saved?

After 25 years of high use and natural wear, a 50 foot section of the North Boardwalk was removed since it was no longer safe for visitors. The “Save the Boardwalks” project will enable a portion of the park’s popular boardwalk trails to be restored.

The accessible boardwalks allow park visitors to experience the flora and fauna of the wetlands, while providing ideal educational and birdwatching opportunities. The boardwalks are vital to the park and its mission.



What is the plan?

The plan is to build a new boardwalk to connect the Delta Boardwalk to the North Boardwalk (see map on page 2 below). The new location of the section of boardwalk will reduce the risk for future flood damage and aligns with the park’s restoration goals.

How will the projects be funded?

The project will be funded from donations to the Friends of Wildwood and grants.

Who benefits from these projects?

This accessible, multi-use, recreational trail provided opportunities for walking, hiking, running, dog walking, environmental education school field trip rotations, day camper experiential learning, ADA access, bird watching, flower walks, frog walks, night walks and other environmental education programs for the general public.
